1] About the Department

The department of Sociology was started in 1969. The first faculty of the department was Prof. Virendra Chaneyya Swami. There had been 1973 Full time faculty. We as a department run B.A. Sociology as a regular course. As well we have few certificate courses. The faculty members are activity involved in research, extension and community services.

Programme Outcomes

- P06** Observation power: A sensible observation power is necessary to identify the research problems in field study. So a perception about human society slowly grows up.
- P07** Communication skills and Social interaction power: Students of Sociology stream have to work beyond the class room boundary at the time of field study activities. As a result, good communication skill develops while interacting with local people.
- P08** Ethical and Social Responsibility: Students have to learn about institutions, folkways, mores, culture, social control, social inequality, population composition, population

policy, society and culture of India. All these helps to instil among the students of Sociology a sense of ethical and social responsibility.
